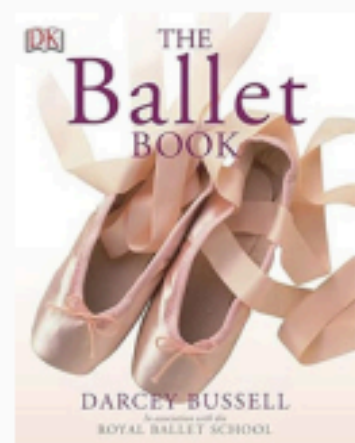

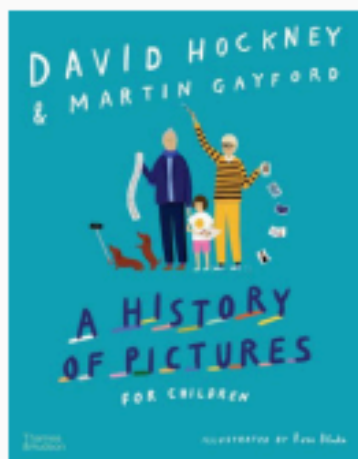

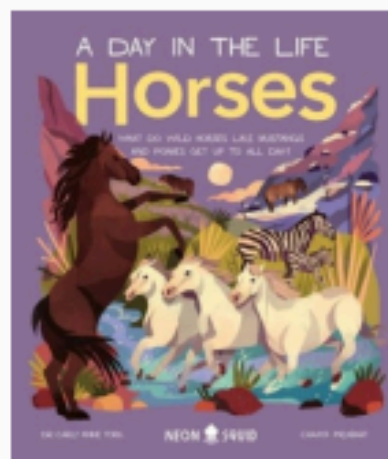


A History of Pictures for Children

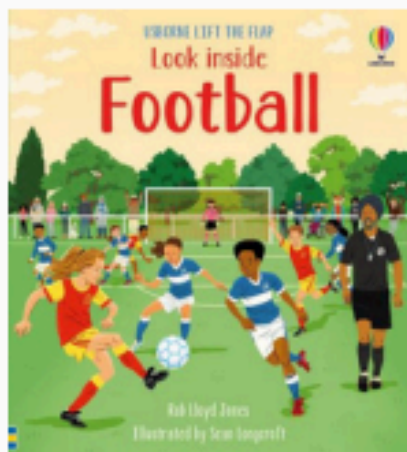
