Assessment week

Next week, the children in Year 1 to Year 6 will be completing some assessments in class. Children absent during the week will need to do "catch up" assessments which can sometimes seem a bit scary as they won't be with their own classes. Year 6 will be doing their assessments in the hall, so that they can get used to the environment and it doesn't surprise them during SATs week at the end of the year.
